SUMMARY: This Notice advises the public that a final Environmental Assessment (EA) for the proposed fee-to-trust acquisition of a 14.993-acre property, for the purpose of developing a casino, hotel, and gas station/convenience store, located in Section 28, Township 26 North, Range 13 East of the Indian Base and Meridian in Washington County, Oklahoma, is available for final public review. Based on the EA, it has been determined that the action will not result in significant impacts to the quality of the human environment; therefore, a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) was signed on January 15, 2025. This Notice is furnished as required by the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) regulations, Title 40, Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Part 1501.9(c)(5), to provide public notice and to inform those persons and agencies who may be interested or affected. This FONSI is a finding on environmental effects, not a decision to proceed, therefore it cannot be appealed.

proposed fee-to-trust acquisition located in Section 28, Township 26 North, Range 13 East of the Indian Base and Meridian in Washington County, Oklahoma. Project activities under the preferred alternative will include the fee-to-trust acquisition, for the purpose of developing a 54,391 sq. ft. casino, 29,902 sq. ft. hotel, and a 4,000 sq. ft. gas station/convenience store.
